This information may be shared on the Vic Emergency website at the time of ignition, as well as the VicEmergency App and internal incident management systems.

Unregistered burn-offs can cause brigades to be called out unnecessarily.

# Update on Waste Management in Murchison



Council are aware of the ongoing issues of illegal dumping and littering within the town of Murchison and across the river system.

In November 2016 Council installed a sign near the public toilets that directs residents/ passer-by's to the Murchison Resource Recovery Centre. This year we have chosen not to provide skip bins near the public toilets instead we have provided public litter bins only. This has resulted in a significant improvement with residents/ campers dumping waste We will be changing our collection

days and frequency for public litter bins in Murchison to be emptied on Tuesdays and Fridays. Council have extended the opening hours of the Murchison Resource Recovery Centre over the holiday periods and plan on doing this for upcoming long weekends including Easter with the aim of providing campers/residents with more options to correctly dispose of waste.

We will work on communicating this more effectively to the community. Currently extended opening hours have been written on the new sign

installed near the public toilets. Various Departments across council including Local laws, RiverConnect, Works, Waste and Parks & Gardens as well as Parks Victoria are working together to implement a campaign to address illegal dumping. The Waste Services team are more than happy to hear the community's recommendations or ideas on how we can improve littering/ illegal dumping in Murchison. ## Chess Table, Great Move!



A recent acquisition to the Historical Society is this fine chess table on a solid pedestal. It was a gift from the Walker family who have strong connections with Murchison.

The table was beautifully handcrafted by an unknown German prisoner of war (POW) while confined to Camp 13 Murchison.

At the end of the war, prior to the POW's repatriation back to their homeland, they needed to have warm clothing as they were returning to the European winter. They sold their craft items in order to buy suitable clothing.

This table was purchased by Len and Jean Walker, probably in late 1946, when they owned a general store in Stevenson Street. They sold many clothing items to the POW's such as woolen trousers, jumpers, cardigans and all the shoes in the shop, including old stock of button-up boots! Their store was very low on stock by the time the POW's were fitted out.

The table was passed down to son Geoff and his wife Dorothy in 1995. Last year they and their son Grant decided to donate the table to the Murchison & District Historical Society.

It is believed the light coloured wood in the table top is silky oak and the darker wood is bull oak.

The table is proudly on display with other craft and information about Camp 13. Come in and have a look - the Murchison Heritage Centre, at 4 Stevenson Street, is open Saturday morning 10 am – 12.30 pm and entry is only a gold coin donation.

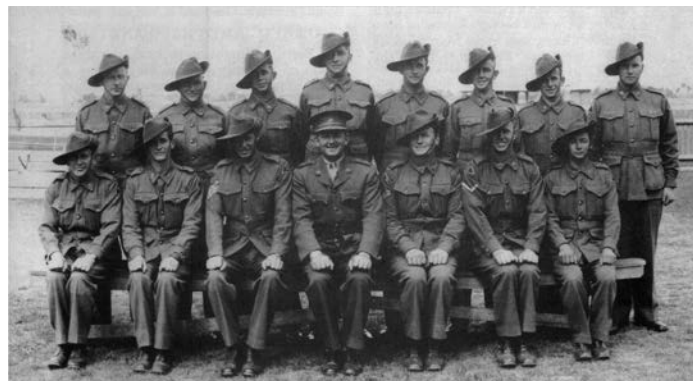
From now on it will see us meeting back at Neighbourhood House at 7.30pm, although time and place can vary occasionally, on the fourth Wednesday of the month with various speakers.
